1. Welcome and Opening Prayer

- b) Dr. Brenda Restoule- provided welcome and opening remarks.

- Excellent how teams are using culture, many examples shared (see March 27th notes for examples)
- people are getting back on the land, main challenge identified was costs associated with some land-based activities; reminder there is a funding available for land-based activities through the Community Support Fund

- Virtual Access to clients? We heard Ontario has teams have access to Ontario Telemedicine Network, however most of the other provinces do not.

3. Virtual Care Site: Cloud DX Clinician Accounts

- Pleased to inform you that FPWC will be purchasing access to a virtual platform for MWT's members. What this
 means is:
 - We will be providing 3 virtual care clinician account to each team
 - Easy to use to virtual platform which clients can download on a laptop or on a smartphone. The clinician sends a link from their laptop (which means remotely, not in a fixed area) and can chat virtually. Can be text or visual
 - Who is considered a clinician in regards to these accounts? anyone supporting clients; i.e. could be a social worker, psychologist, cultural support worker, Elder, Healer, etc...
 - Turnaround to get account up and running is pretty quick.

Roxanne – Dene Nation

- Suggestion a lot of urban members are not getting financial support that communities are getting.
 - 1) Who and how do we access it? We will ask Dr. Valerie Gideon to address it more specifically.
 - 2) How did they determine how much each FN receives? Decisions came from Ministers/Deputy Ministers and than forwarded to Valerie, unsure of the formula.

- Idea: Radio's and TV's may be another way to support teams in areas that have no internet/date
- Issue: how do address isolation community "with no nursing station". How do you address this?
- ISC is working to try a private transportation for food and medical supplies
- FPWC is looking to create additional resources which include more information sheets, webinars, virtual sharing circles and sharing other- want to include youth, parents/ care providers, children & youth, traditional healers, etc. Will focus on specific topics and include guest speakers.

Roxanne Cook- Is there money available for translation of resources, there are 5 different dialects in the North. i.e. Dene Nation to have our own language

Dr. Brenda Restoule- Thank you for identifying the need for language, will contact FNIHB to address how we offer the supports for the webinars.

Dr. Ed Connors- Language is crucial issue for connecting with the North.

Note: Import to flow funding for translation through FN and not the government as this does not meet community needs.
